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## **NEXT 30 DAYS OF MITIGATION STRATEGY AND ACTION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF MONDOVI, BUFFALO COUNTY, WISCONSIN March 17, 2020**

### SUMMARY:

The City realizes small towns such as Mondovi, information spreads rapidly. We will not participate in this and as of Friday, March 13, 2020 the regional community and City do not have any confirmed cases of the Coronavirus infection. The CDC provides procedures on how to mitigate and it is the City's intention to follow as many as possible with the restricted access to necessary supplies. It is the goal of the City to prevent the spreading of this infection by following as many as possible CDC's steps and procedures in the mitigation of Coronavirus (COVID-19) – where humanly possible.

### GOALS:

These approaches are used to minimize morbidity and mortality caused by COVID-19 and minimize social and economic impacts of COVID-19. Individuals, communities, businesses, and healthcare organizations are all part of a community mitigation strategy. It is the City of Mondovi's mitigation goal at this time to protect and/or:

- work to prevent of its spread; especially among our senior community members;
- provide informational resources to aid in its spread to residents and businesses alike through the City's social media and website;
- ensure City services continue without interruption at the same service level if possible;
- respond to assist where needed and within the non-emergency services skill and comfort level of City staff members so long as they feel safe
- keep the integrity of individuals health information private accordingly to law;
- assist caretakers of those infected or exposed of their next steps;

### IMPLEMENTATION EMPHASIZES:

- Emphasizing individual responsibility for implementation of recommended personal-level actions
- Empowering businesses, schools, and community organizations to implement recommended actions, particularly in ways that protect persons at risk of severe illness such as older adults and persons with 2 serious underlying health conditions (e.g., people requiring dialysis, or those with congestive heart failure or emphysema)
- Focusing on settings that provide critical services to implement recommended actions to protect critical infrastructure and individuals at risk of severe disease
- Minimizing disruptions to daily life to the extent possible

### **Emergency Service:**

1. Identify EMS, Police and Firefighter needs, including Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): Supplies available for up to three (3) months.

2. Identify locations and methods for decontaminating personnel: 1 shower and Bathroom at Ambulance Headquarters. 1 shower and Bathroom at Fire Dept.
3. Identify appropriate staffing levels to operate ambulance service in the event of escalated operations: No, Staffing not adequate for escalated operations.
4. Establish methods to decontaminate emergency vehicles between transports and estimate the amount of time before available for next transport: Yes, 2 full-service Ambulance Units. This is done between trips. (2 ½ hours) Back in service.
5. Identify treatment methods if individuals are self-quarantined and need assistance: Yes, Treat and Street may need to use other resources fire department, Red Cross...
6. Establish emergency isolated facilities to triage infected patients prior to transporting to a medical facility: Marten Center
7. Identify plan of action to properly sanitize and maintain triage location: Ready site with 12 bed stations ventilation, lighting, bathrooms, exists, laundry supplies.
8. Identify the number of people living in assisted living facilities within the city and establish methods to communicate deteriorating conditions if necessary.
